APPENDIX A

Mr Bridges, Shawfield Road:

Problem with youths throwing stones from the canal towpath at adjacent properties, causing damage to his conservatory roof. PCSO Nicola Carr advised that the police were aware of this problem and looking to resolve it in the near future.

Hazel Cox, Beetons Avenue:

Concerned that the dog bins in Ash Recreation Ground are not being emptied regularly. Parish Office to contact Guildford Borough Council

Mr Salter, Ashbourne Close:

Concerned at a dangerous stretch of road in Ash Green, as his sons vehicle had been nearly forced off the road by a lorry. He has reported this to Surrey County Council. Councillor Marsha Moseley informed the meeting that the Local Committee would be meeting at Lord Pirbright's Hall in Pirbright on Wednesday 10 March 2010 and that there would be a public question time.

Hazel Cox, Beetons Avenue:

Concerned at parked cars in Shawfield Road obscuring sight line for vehicles exiting Beetons Avenue. Parish Office to reiterate problem to Guildford Borough Council.

Richard Tolley, Grange Farm Road:

Passing on concerns about parking in Foreman Road. The Chairman of Council advised that the police had looked at this problem but it was not deemed to be an obstruction or against the Highway Code. This matter has been listed for the next Parking Review.

Mr Tolley also passed on his congratulations for the work that had been carried out in Love Lane, but advised there was a section of fencing that needed attention to the rear of College Road.
