# Supporting Families in Guildford



#### **Home-Start Guildford**

Home-Start Guildford is an independent charity which supports local families. Since 1996 their trained volunteers have visited families in their own homes to help them cope with the stresses and stains of bringing up a young family when things get tough. They have a powerful impact on the lives of local families every day, offering support that cuts across all boundaries, of social class, ethnic origin, gender and financial status.

Home-Start will help families (with at least one child under 5) deal with whatever life throws at them. They support parents as they learn to cope, improve their confidence and build better lives for their children. They provide one to one support for parents tailored to the needs of the family. Trained volunteers visit the family's home for a couple of hours every week, for as long as the support is needed, usually on average for 9 to 12 months. The volunteers offer confidential, non judgemental, practical and emotional support which builds parents confidence and helps them stand on their own two feet.

"It was like we were lost in the sea and Home-Start was the lifeboat. They saved us." Mum of 2 from Ash.

Home-Start help families with complex needs and families at risk of social exclusion including those who are reluctant to engage with other services. They run social events for families in the school holidays when things at home can get a bit fraught!

Home-Start Guildford work in partnership with children's centres, Surrey County Council Children's Services, other Surrey Home-Start schemes and other local charities.

Volunteer for Home-Start and make a difference to a family in the community. Volunteering is not difficult but it makes such a difference to so many lives. Their training course prepares volunteers for all situation and Scheme Manager Liz Westwood and her staff are there to support volunteers at all times. #### Chairman's Bit



On behalf of the staff and Councillors of Ash Parish Council may I take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy New Year.

There has been much talk and rumour about, the now somewhat sad site, where the former Standard of England Public House still stands. The facts are as follows. On 25 November 2015, the supermarket chain, Morrison's, were formally granted planning permission, by Guildford Borough Council.

The permission allows for the erection of a part two storey, part single storey building, containing a convenience store (Use Class A1) at ground level and a two bedroom flat above, together with lorry, car and cycle parking, improvements to access, bin and plant store and landscaping following demolition of the existing building.

Class A1 use is extensive, but includes the retail sale of goods; it is also worth noting that the former public house carried a Class A1 use and so without making any alterations, Morrison's could still trade from the premises without needing any planning permission.

Morrison's now have 3 years to implement the recently granted planning permission should they choose to do. More details regarding the planning application and subsequent approval can be found on Guildford Borough Council's website and the planning reference is 15/P00313.

"OUT and ABOUT ASH VALE (2013)" (the Film) had a "red carpet premiere" during October 2015. It was attended by Councillors Nigel Manning and Marsha Moseley, together with members of the local community, many of whom had made contributions to the film.

Ann Wonfor has lived in Ash Vale for over 30 years, and during October 2012 had this idea..... The idea being that Ann would make a film about Ash Vale throughout one particular year, with the year being 2013.

Ann, who had at the time absolutely no experience or skills for making a film, enrolled the help of a number of people including, John Bolton, who has many years of experience in both computing and photography/ video production and Dick Elsey, who set up recording equipment at St Mary's Church to record Joy Cobb on the piano and Meryl Davies singing "O Holy Night".

Although most of the still photography and video footage was undertaken by Ann she also obtained additional photographs from Ash Parish Council's Graham Bidwell and Ian Arnold. Other contributions

to the film were made by Peter and John Cody, Nigel Manning, Marsha Moseley, Richard Tolley and Eric Marsh. Sally Jenkinson, curator of The Ash Museum kindly allowed Ann to use information from her book *Ash and Ash Vale* and also provided historical photographs from the museum archive.

Ann had hoped to have finished the film by the end of 2014 but it was not completed until July 2015. The original idea was that the film should run for something like 30 minutes but it ended up running for 67 minutes in total. The film was well received at the premier with the audience laughing at the quirky bits. The film has been made into a DVD and copies will be given to Ash Museum, the Basingstoke Canal Society and other local groups. The film also shows how the area has changed, even since the film was recorded in 2013.
