Ash Parish Council are planning a traditional Village Fete to celebrate Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's 90th birthday.

The fete will be held on Saturday 18th June from 2:00pm until 5:00pm, at the Ash Centre and Recreation Ground, Ash Hill Road, Ash.

Plans for this celebration event are still being drawn up as this edition of *Ash Matters* goes to print, but it is anticipated that there will be a number of traditional attractions during the afternoon

There will be a variety of stalls including games, tombola's, raffles and much more.

There will be a Children's Fancy Dress competition with a theme of Kings and Queens, with a King and Queen being chosen for the afternoon. Refreshments including a beer and wine tent, a barbeque, ice creams and tea and coffee will be available throughout. A picnic area is to be set aside.

There will also be a show competition of flowers, vegetables, flower arranging, cakes and crafts. Their members range from beginners to experienced crafts-people. They run several workshops each year, to introduce people to Spinning, Weaving and Dyeing, or to extend their skills. They are also a member of the Association of Guilds which run a summer school and national exhibition in alternate years.

As well as meetings at Ash they have a guest speaker meeting once a month at the Farnham United Reformed church and further Spinning and Weaving days at The Rural Life Centre in Tilford.

The West Surrey Guild of Spinners, Weavers and Dyers is a friendly group with about 90 members. They have meetings twice a month in the Victoria Hall, Ash Hill Road, Ash, on the first Monday and second Wednesday of each month from 10:30am until 3:00pm. Members and visitors meet to chat and spin, weave or do other textile crafts.

Visitors are always welcome, so please feel free to drop by and say "Hello" and see what they are doing, or take your own project and join them for the day. There is a £3 charge for visitors (who stay for the day), which includes tea, coffee and biscuits. 

St Mary's Ash Vale 1914-1918 World War 1 Commemorative Booklet



St Mary's Church Ash Vale has a memorial dedicated to St Mary's parishioners who were killed in the two World Wars. The memorial is a simple brass cross with a framed written record of those who were killed behind it.

In 2014 St Mary's congregation were challenged to find out information they could about some of the World War 1 names on the memorial.

During July 2014 a joint Service of Reconciliation

Introduction
In the body of St Mary's Church building, at the back opposite the main entrance, on a ledge above the sound amplification control deak, it a simple brass cross and behind at a beutility written list of the names of members of St Mary's who were killed in World Wars 1 and 2. Early in 2014 the Pervend Nell Lambert the Vicar of St Mary's Ash Valle, gave a challenge to the congregation. The challenge was to take one of the names from that ist and find out what we could about that person. This intention effectively gave the present-day congregation and members of the parish the opportunity to find a connection through those commemorated on the WM1 section of the St Mary's War Memoratio.

This WW1 commemorative booklet is a summarised compilation of the research the team at St Mary's curred out and brings this project to a close.

and Forgiveness was held with the local Lutheran German language congregation. The event fostered goodwill, Christian fellowship and shared stories.

During 2014 Ash Parish Council had the Ash War Memorial cleaned and restored, and on 10th August 2014 the Memorial was rededicated at a well attended service led by the local clergy. Over the same weekend Ash

the Memorial was rededicated at a well attended service led by the local clergy. Over the same weekend Ash Museum also presented an amazing exhibition in the Victoria Hall focused on the centenary. The St Mary's World War 1 research was included among the many items displayed from the Ash Museum archives and also items gathered from local families.

The St Mary's World War 1 research team came together voluntarily to tackle the challenge. Ash Museum was represented at most of the research teams meetings and gave access to their archives and also much help and encouragement.

After the Service of Reconciliation, the War Memorial Rededication and the exhibition at the Victoria Hall, it was felt by the research team that all the information gathered should not go to waste and a respectful summary for commemoration and future reference would be appropriate.

The commemorative booklet was compiled from the material researched and with the complimentary services of Design Hive, Farnham it was given a professional layout and presentation. The cost of printing the booklet in full colour however did pose a difficulty. However the Surrey County Councillor for Ash, Councillor Marsha Moseley provided a members grant and the booklet is now generally available.

The St. Mary's Ash Vale 1914-1918 World War 1 Commemorative Booklet summarises the research that was carried out and provides a well presented record and respectful addition to the memorials in St Mary's Church and Ash. Copies can be obtained from the Ash Museum (open every third Sunday Afternoon), the Thursday morning café held at St Mary's in Vale Road, and also from the Chapel in Wharf Road, during its Friday morning café.

The. booklet is available for a small donation of £3 to £5 which will go toward either the Ash Museum running costs or to establish a St. Mary's administered community development fund designed to facilitate specific occasional short term projects of a similar nature. Launched in August 2015 by CTC (The National Cycling Charity) Development Officer Susan Keywood, the club has taken strides in its growth and now proudly presents four highly enthusiastic trained ride leaders who are taking the club to its next stage and offering weekly led cycle rides for all.

Ash Velo is open to adults and families, anyone who wants to cycle at a gentle and easy pace, get back on their bike, improve cycle skills, learn local bike routes or simply build confidence and strength. The club offers a fortnightly Wednesday afternoon 5 mile easy ride, alternative Saturday and Sunday rides of about 10 - 15 miles and a monthly family ride, to give both parents and children a unique opportunity to cycle together.

Ash Velo rides usually consist of planned routes on a variety of cycle pathways, including off-road and on quiet roads, the canal towpath, the Blackwater Valley cycle pathway and might even take in parts of the Christmas Pie trail. Wey Valley Bowls




