

Land South of Ash Lodge Drive (A2Dominium Phase)

Streets D and E

Street D is in tithe parcel 239, and street E is partly in the same field and partly in tithe parcel 241.

So in 1844 parcel 239 was owned by the Trustees of Headley School. It was part of the property which became Ash Lodge, from which Ash Lodge Drive gets its name.

In 1744 this property was leased to Reverend George Holme DD, the Rector of Headley. In 1755 Rev Holme founded a free school for 12 poor children in Headley, providing a master's residence and endowing the school with a house and 2½ acres of land in Whitmore Valley and an annuity charged on his estate at Ash. Reverend Holme died in 1765 and various Trustees of Headley School then became responsible for it until the lease expired.

I would suggest:

Street D could be Headley Way (or Headley School Way)

Street E could be Holme Close

Streets F and G

These roads both occupy parcel 244 on the Ash tithe map. The field was called Stones in 1844 and Great Stones in 1810.

From 1798-1810 it was owned by William Goodchild of Hartley Wintney, gentleman, who held quite a lot of land in Ash which was split up and sold after his death. There is a lovely Sale Particular held at Surrey History Centre which gives all the details along with a plan (SHC ref 1487/21/4) William married Elizabeth Chapman, an orphaned relative brought up by William Giblett, from whom she inherited the land which had once belonged to Henry Slyfield. It is an interesting story.

I would suggest:

Street F could be Great Stones Way

Street G could be Goodchild Close
