ANNUAL REPORT MARCH 2020

Background

In 1973, Miss Winifred Massey, bequeathed the capital proceeds from the sale of Hereford House, Firacre Road, to the parishioners of Ash. This was in grateful recognition of the work done in the Parish of Ash, by her Grandfather, Mr James Payne.

Grants

Today, the charity makes payments of minor capital grants to people who live in Ash and other local organisations which give **specific** benefit to Ash parishioners. The Trustees are restricted to benefiting Ash residents only. Applications from organisations which have a proportion of non-Ash residents will **NOT** be considered.

In the last financial year, the Trustees awarded grants totalling £8530.55.

Investments

The Trustee's management policy remains unchanged; to continue the maximisation of the Fund's growth but leaving the returns on assets available for grants. Our Investment decisions have been made in accordance with discussions and advice from the stockbrokers for many years, Walker Cripps.

At 30th January 2020, the value of the portfolio of assets is approximately £207,000.
