

Dog Mess & The Effect of Toxocariasis

We make no apology for raising the issue once again, but there has been another increase in the amount of dog fouling that is taking place that is not being cleared up by the dog's owners. As well as being unpleasant, dog mess is also unhygienic and a major health hazard. The key issue



is that dog faeces can lead to toxocariasis in humans, and in particular children where it can cause blindness. To help in the reduction of the problem of dog fouling please report to Guildford Borough Council on 01483 505050 any dog walker not picking up their dog's mess. The report should include details of the date, time and location together with as much of a description as possible of the owner and the dog.

Ash Parish Council donates £1365 to Frimley Park Hospital



Throughout each year Ash Parish Council (APC) organises community events, including the Village Fete and Christmas Fantasia. All the Council's profits are collected from these events and donated to a single charity. For the year ending 31st December 2022 APC collected £1365 which has now been donated to Frimley Park Hospital via the Frimley Health Charity. Donations to the charity help to provide specialist equipment and to drive life changing improvements to healthcare and services across our local community.

New play equipment approved for Harpers Recreation Ground



Following consultation with residents, Ash Parish Council has approved the purchase of a new piece of play equipment to be installed at Harper's Recreation Ground. Planning is underway and work is expected to be completed by the Summer of this year.

Teen shelter installed

Ash Parish Council has installed a new teen shelter within Ash Recreation Ground. A public consultation took place during the summer of 2022, which presented four designs and the proposed location. Following this consultation, the teen shelter with the most positive feedback has now been installed.

Pedestrian Crossing for Ash Hill Road Completed

Surrey County Council (SCC) has completed the Ash Hill Road zebra crossing. Work started at the beginning of November 2022 and included the reinstatement of the public footpath to allow access to the crossing. The crossing now provides a safer route to the north side of Ash Hill Road Coronation Gardens car park and the recreational areas beyond.



New footpath in Carrington Recreation Ground

Following concerns raised by local residents, Ash Parish Council has allocated funding to install a new footpath between Carrington Lane and the rear entrance of Holly Lodge School. This will join up with the existing footpath running from Lysons Avenue. At present, due to the number



of vehicles which use the car park, this area is particularly dangerous for children who attend Holly Lodge School. At drop off and pick up times, pedestrians are often forced to walk in the busy car park where cars are constantly moving. This project, due to be completed by the end of March 2023, will provide a much safer route for all pedestrians who use this part of Carrington Recreation Ground.

Ash Parish Council Meeting Dates

The Council meets face-to-face on the 2nd Monday of each month, except August & bank holidays, for its Full Council meetings. The Planning Committee and the Amenities, Finance & Administration (AFA) Committee usually meet on the 4th Monday of the month. These committee meetings are currently being held virtually. Ash Parish Council reinstated the footpath which runs along the southern edge of Ash recreation ground. This path was identified in a recent APC survey that advised the path was beyond economic repair. The work was completed in November 2022.
