#### Council reduces cost to Hire Halls and Kitchen

At a recent Council meeting, Ash Parish Council (APC) agreed to reduce the cost of hire of the Halls, Rooms, and Kitchen at the Ash Centre. The adaptable and spacious design enables the fully air-conditioned Centre to serve admirably as a venue for commercial, social events and sporting activities. The Centre has dedicated parking and easy access for the disabled. With each booking, the Centre Staff will prepare the hall to your specification, managing the placement of tables and chairs for you. #### Ash Parish Council donates £2600 to Royal Surrey Hospital Charity

Throughout each year Ash Parish Council (APC) organises community events, including the Village Fete and Christmas Fantasia. All the Council's profits are collected from these events and donated to a single charity. Following last year's donation to the Frimley Park Health Charity, for the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2023 APC collected £2600 which has now been donated to the Royal Surrey NHS Foundation Trust. This money can be used to purchase new equipment, support new and enhanced facilities, for example, specialist, reclining chemotherapy chairs for our Chemotherapy Day Unit or help support major refurbishments such as the multi-million-pound Cancer Centre

#### Coronation Car Park to be resurfaced and parking spaces marked

The Parish Council has confirmed that it is to resurface its free to use carpark at Coronation Gardens, opposite the Victoria Hall. Once resurfaced, car park space markings will be painted to allow a more efficient use of the available space. The design is yet to be finalised, but the Council expects to be able to cater for 48 standard and 2 disabled parking bays. Guildford Borough Council has now removed the recycling bins from this car park as that service has now been withdrawn. The nearest waste and recycling centres are Farnham and Camberley. #### **Ash Youth Club update**

The Ash Youth Club Management Committee continues to meet regularly as it fundraises. Their aim is to raise funds to employ a Youth Worker, which will enable an Open Access Youth Club once a week for 11 to 17 years olds.

#### **Hedgehog Highway Project**

As part of the Council's objective to promote Biodiversity within our Parish, the Council is supporting the Hedgehog

Highway project by donating "Hedgehog Highway Surrounds" and Hedgehog Houses to local schools including Shawfield Primary School, Ash Walsh Infant & Junior School. A Hedgehog Highway is a 5-inch gap in a fence or wall allowing access for Hedgehogs. Other names include 'Hedgehog Door', 'Hedgehog Hole' and 'Hedgehog Tunnel'. These gaps are essential in the battle to prevent the extinction of Hedgehogs. The Hedgehog Highway allows hedgehogs to forage for food, meet mates to breed, and access nesting sites. #### **Get involved with the Basingstoke Canal Society:**

■ The Basingstoke Canal Society (BCS) are guardians of the Basingstoke Canal and have been promoting and campaigning for its future since 1966. The BCS are responsible for the upkeep of the Canal, however they continue to struggle to raise the funding needed to maintain the Canal. The Society has stated



there is currently a £120,000 shortfall and warns that the survival of the Canal is at risk. As such it has taken action to involve the Community and local businesses with their campaign 'Keep your Canal Alive'. You can become a member for £15 per year. The BCS currently has over 290 volunteers, who provide 28,000 hours work per year. These Volunteers are critical to keeping the Canal alive and available to all to use for exercise, sport, relaxation, etc. It's a fantastic local amenity but without our Community's collective help, it is at risk of falling back into disuse. The BCS are currently recruiting for a number of roles, such as Project Leaders, Fundraiser, Marketing, IT Support and more. #### Food Parcels Project & Community Fridge

Ash Villages Food Parcels Project team have opened a Community Fridge, located at The Chapel, Wharf Rd, GU12 5AY. This project is working closely with the Parish's two local Co-ops. #### Ash Road Bridge update



Guildford Borough Council has advised that work on the Ash Road Bridge has been forging ahead, despite the impact of several storms over the winter months. The sites have been cleared, site offices installed on the south site, embankments constructed, and piling completed on both sides of the railway. Traffic management is in place with Foreman Road closed between Ash Church Road and Foreman Park. Traffic is being diverted along Grange
